 practice, go to work, get home, do homework, collapse into bed. That doesn't even include the endless chores that parents give, or your free time when you want to visit some friends, watch that important TV show, or simply just relax. With all these chores to do, there seems to be no time to keep our rooms clean, wash our cars, or even think about organizing our lockers. Each student's priorities seem to be a little different: some may think it is important to clean their bedroom, while others may ignore the piles of clothes on the floor so they can check their email instead. $51 \%$ of Midway students say that they spend 1 hour or less in their bedrooms per day. What time students do spend in their bedrooms may be divided between talking on the phone, listening to music, or creatively reorganizing their decor. $91 \%$ of Midway students have a CD player to listen to in their rooms, and $38 \%$ have a phone to talk on. Most students would probably much rather have "talk on the phone", or "listen to music" on their to-do list than cleaning, homework, or chores.
